*Motivating Facts: Toads are strictly carnivorous, feeding on beetles, slugs, flies, crickets, and ants. Larger toad species even eat small rodents and snakes - anything they can pull into their mouths and swallow! So, when it comes to natural pest control, toads in your garden are a boon!

Like all amphibians, toads are highly sensitive to environmental toxins. They easily absorb pesticides, fertilizers, and other chemical pollutants through their skin. When exposed to high levels of these, toads won't survive. So, if you have toads in your yard, there's a good possibility that you have created a sustainable environment for all kinds of life. Give yourself a pat on the back!

Do you enjoy exploring the world of flowers and wish you could creatively record your discoveries somehow on paper? Please join us as we begin our investigation of flowers by covering a variety of techniques to creatively capture your observations on paper.
